Disbursement of Recovered Criminal Proceeds to China

Portfolio Attorney-General

On 13 December 2022, the Cabinet External Relations and Security Committee:

- **noted** that the High Court has made asset forfeiture orders against Xiaohua Gong in respect of property to the total value of \$70.3 million;
- noted that it is alleged Mr Gong benefited from a pyramid scheme fraud perpetrated in the People's Republic of China (PRC);
- noted that an agreement in principle has been reached with the PRC to split the forfeited assets 55/45 in the PRC's favour;
- 4 **noted** that sharing the funds with the PRC would be consistent with the recommendations of international bodies, international rules concerning the proceeds of crime, and domestic guidance on asset sharing;

5 **noted** that:

- 5.1 asset sharing encourages and rewards collaboration between foreign and domestic law enforcement;
- 5.2 New Zealand Police seeks recognition as an effective international law enforcement partner, and will continually leverage that reputation to deliver safety and security outcomes for New Zealand;
- **noted** that if the funds are not shared with the PRC, the money would remain in the Proceeds of Crime Fund;
- 7 agreed that the Crown transfer \$38,712,000 from the Proceeds of Crime Fund to the PRC;
- 8 **agreed** to establish the following appropriation:

- noted that the non-departmental other expense *Transfer to Other Governments of Relevant Seized Assets* appropriation was previously established in 2017 to give effect to a similar asset sharing arrangement;
- **agreed** to the following changes to appropriations to give effect to paragraph 7 above, with a corresponding impact on the operating balance and net debt:

- agreed that although there is a corresponding impact on the operating balance and net debt, the cost is covered by revenue recovered, and therefore fiscally neutral and not counted against any allowances;
- agreed that the change to the appropriation for 2022/23 above be included in the 2022/23 Supplementary Estimates, and that the increase be met from Imprest Supply;
- directed the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade and New Zealand Police to formally approach the PRC:
 - to confirm Cabinet's approval of the asset sharing arrangement reached in principle to split the assets 55/45 in the PRC's favour;
 - 13.2 to confirm with the PRC the process for transferring the funds to the PRC.
